From The Pastor's Study:

This last week I preached on our need to "Live to the Lord" based on the scriptures for the day (Matthew 18:21-35 and Romans 14:1-12). Jesus and Paul both talked about a need to live for God; to put God first in our lives. If we are going to put God first in our lives, we have to put God's priorities first in our lives. Many times I hear people complain that living for God in this day and time is not easy; in fact, it is next to impossible. People around us live according to the mores of society which seem to put self first, consider anger and revenge acceptable, and make judgment a part of how we live. While it is true that living for God is not easy, it is also true that living for God in our daily lives is NOT impossible. God calls us to put God and others before our own wants, to let go of anger and revenge as we forgive others as God has forgiven us, that we allow God to render judgment while we lovingly strive to share God's love and grace. It starts by our making God's priorities our priorities. If you think that is hard for individuals, just think how hard that can be for corporations in today's cut-throat business society. Yet even in a world where profit drives corporations, there are those who are thriving by living for God. I know that for a bookstore, like Mardels, putting God first would be obvious since it is a Christian bookstore. What about an arts and craft store like Hobby Lobby or even a fast food restaurant? For them to put God first is an even bigger statement of who they are and what they believe. .

I want you to hear a story about a fast food restaurant that puts God first in its understanding of business. This information comes from Jim Hogsett in *Ministry Workers Newsletter*.

"In 1946, a gentleman opened a restaurant which he named the Dwarf Grill. When the owner opened that first restaurant, he wrote down some Christian business principles which would be incorporated into his business charter. Among those was a commitment to his God that he would NEVER open his business on Sunday. His was **NOT** the proclamation of a prosperity gospel which says "I will follow God and then I expect Him to reward me with great riches." Instead, it was a genuine commitment from a Christian gentleman who has steadfast convictions based on the Gospel. He understands that his Creator is not in the LET'S MAKE A DEAL business. Today, Truett Cathy owns **over 1500 restaurants** and the name of his gigantic chain is now **Chick-fil-A!** Restaurant entrepreneurs often measure their sales volume by the square foot of the building's floor space. **Chick-fil-A** has more sales per square foot operating six days a week than **McDonalds'** which is open seven days a week! AND, its sales have increased *every consecutive year* since it was founded!

During a recent sermon (Hogsett continues), my pastor referred to **Chick-fil-A** as being one of his favorite restaurants. He did report one recent problem. He said that when he and his family reached the drive-in window, the clerk stated the order was not ready and asked the pastor to park and the order would be brought to the car. As my pastor prepared to pay for the meal, the clerk said there would be NO CHARGE, that the mistake should not have been made! Isn't it amazing how employees behave when they have the proper direction from the top of the organization?

How can anyone who studies the life of Truett Cathy ever say that we can not live the **CHRISTIAN** life in the workplace? Even if our company doesn't put God first we still should. My Christian brothers and sisters, I am constantly reminded that life is all about **choices**. I have a news bulletin for the demonic forces in this world: You can NEVER separate me from my Savior unless I choose not to let Him in...and that includes the jobsite where I spend over one third of my lifetime!" Because of the great Presbyterian Women study of Revelation this past year, there was interest in Beth Moore's "Revelation" study, recently published. As we try to flip/flop New Testament studies with Old Testament studies, we decided on "Daniel" for this fall and "Revelation" in the spring. (The second half of Daniel is primarily prophecy which ties into Revelation.)

This "Daniel" study is twelve weeks and will conclude the last week of November, taking off the week of Thanksgiving.

This is really two six-week studies: The first six-weeks is "Lives of Integrity" (recall Daniel in the lion's den and Shadrach, Meshack and Abednego in the fiery furnace?) and the second six-weeks is "Words of Prophecy" (recall the unfathomable "numbers" which are to foretell things to come?).

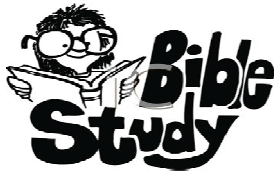
