From the Pastor's Study:

One thing about living in Fort Worth, Texas, is that we do get some harsh winter weather, but it doesn't last long. Transplants from the North are often amused at how everything shuts down at the first sign of snow or ice. We try to explain to them that it is not that the weather is so severe, but that it is simply not what we are used to negotiating. (Talk to us about our punishing summer heat!) Our roads are not salted, we don't have snow chains on our tires (many of us don't even know what those are), and our communities do not operate snowplows to keep the roads clear. Granted, parts of Texas, such as the panhandle, are no stranger to blizzards, but here in Fort Worth we just stay off the roads as much as possible.

We are just finishing up our annual two weeks of extremely cold weather and we hope that is all this season will bring. Thankfully, it was not accompanied by snow and ice that would have snapped tree limbs and brought down power lines! The power outages were not widespread and were of limited duration – for which we are all very thankful. Unlike some recent years, we seem to have skated by with minimal problems. All of which started me thinking about how preparing for winter weather is a lot like the preparation we do in our spiritual lives.

We often take all kinds of precautions when bad weather is in the forecast. We cover our outside faucets, make grocery runs to stock up on essentials, fill any prescriptions we may need, bring in the pets and potted plants, gas up the cars, make sure we have batteries and emergency candles, and leave drips running in all of our sinks. We very much hope that bad situations will not arise, but we do what we can to be ready just in case.

We do the same thing in our spiritual lives, too. While we benefit daily from our church friendships and our communion with God, and we do a lot of good work through mission and outreach, there is also an element of "emergency preparation." By that I mean that the time we spend in worship and Sunday School, in prayer and in daily Bible study all help to strengthen our relationship with God. So that when our spiritual weather gets bad, we are better prepared to face hardship. Even if your life has been pretty smooth sailing so far, I can guarantee that at some point storms will come. The time to prepare is now.

Spend time with God in prayer and study and worship and praise. When we have trouble and heartache in our lives it is completely natural to turn to our trusted friends for comfort and support. How much easier is it to turn to God in our times of trouble if He is already a close and trusted friend? The more we rely on Him while dealing with the small things, the easier it is to rely on Him when the big storms hit.



Treasurer's Corner - January 2024

At the end of December, the church had \$142,274.93 in the primary checking account. Of this, \$82,124.44 is available in the general fund operating account. This represents 2.4 months of 2023's budgeted operating expenses.

December income was up dramatically compared to November. December was a five Sunday month, plus there were a number of large year-end donations to both pledged and open plate income. Pledges were 148% of budget, while Open Plate was 152% of budget. Income for the month was \$48,792.28 and expenses were \$38,422.32, resulting in a net increase in the general fund of \$10,369.96. For the year, total income was \$401,295.55 (104% of budget); Expenses were \$396,047.22 (96% of budget). Session adopted a deficit budget in 2023, projecting a reduction in the general fund of approximately \$25,000. Due to the congregation's generosity, we actually posted an increase in the general fund of \$5,248.33.

The mortgage fund had a starting balance of \$1,178.26. We received mortgage fund donations in December of \$2,636.00. An additional principal payment of \$1,150 was paid in December. The mortgage balance is \$33,481.68. An additional payment of \$1,600 was paid January 4. Excluding any further additional principal payments, the mortgage will pay off in September of 2024.



All insurance policies have been renewed, but the property policy increased by 12.5%. The total insurance bill for 2024 is approximately \$51,500. Our insurance agent approached eighteen companies for quotes; sixteen declined.

National Mentoring Month Celebrates Kids Hope USA Mentors

January was National Mentoring Month, and WPC is celebrating the life-changing relationships with students at Bruce Shulkey Elementary through Kids Hope USA. January recognized the faithful commitment of volunteer mentors who show up so students know they are loved and cared for.

Kids Hope USA is a national mentoring organization that equips churches to send volunteers into their neighborhood elementary schools to serve as mentors in a one-on-one relationship. Standing alongside parents, teachers, principals and counselors, mentors show kids they are valued and loved. Together they play games, read, do schoolwork, talk and much more. This intentional time helps provide the student with support, motivation and confidence to learn and achieve.

Westminster volunteer mentors visit Bruce Shulkey students once a week. We currently have 5 mentors who will begin weekly visits with their mentees soon. Our long-time partnership has been on hiatus since Covid. The program is supported by Dr. Hogg and Patricia Klint, who recruit volunteers that are screened and trained to meet one-on-one with children who are identified as needing additional support and encouragement. Mentors and students meet once a week for up to one hour at the school during the school day.

That hour can make a big difference, experiencing an improvement in academic skills and reading, feel a sense of greater confidence, and better social/emotional behaviors.

During National Mentoring Month, WPC celebrated the impact mentors are having in the lives of students in their own community and invites others to learn more about this transformative mentoring organization.

Through the power of relationship, kids build resilience and a brighter future.
